### **Race for the Line Competition**

On Thursday 28th June a group of four Year 7 students took part in the national final of the Race for the Line rocket car competition, held at RAF Wittering, where they were kindly taken to by Mr Gibson.

Students worked using a variety of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Maths) skills to build a final version of their car, after successfully winning their local and regional finals, competing against 70,000 students nationally throughout the competition.

At the final, 57 teams from across the country built cars and raced them in a final drag race. Students also had the opportunity to take part in a host of STEM activities provided by the Royal Navy and Royal Air Force, had the chance to see several air displays, including an impressive show by the Red Arrows and were addressed by HRH The Countess of Wessex to celebrate their achievements. Well done to the students and staff involved!



### Year 7 Engaging Education Competition

Over the last term, Miss Groves and the English Department orchestrated a competition for the whole of Year 7. Students competed against each other to produce an engaging adventure book for a competition run through Engaging Education; they had to write a creative and exciting adventure book aimed at Year 6 students, consisting of illustrations, characters, educational activities and a brilliant plot.

#### Wakefield State Schools Athletics Championships

# School Trips & Visits



## **Geography Field Trip**

On 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> of July, 150 Year 10s visited Bridlington on the Yorkshire coast to conduct fieldwork. The students were investigating the effects of longshore drift in the area, and also patterns of land use in the town centre. The data collected and subsequent analysis will contribute to 15% of their final examinations.



#### Year 8 & 9 Visit to Harry Potter

On 20<sup>th</sup> June, 90 students from Year 8 and Year 9 visited Harry Potter World in Leavesdon. A great time was had by both staff and students who attended, and they got to visit the world of Harry Potter, seeing iconic things such as Hogwarts Express, Platform 9 3/4s, The Knight Bus, The Great Hall, The Cupboard Under the Stairs, and a full 3D model of the castle itself. Simply magical. A great opportunity to fuel the students' flair for creative writing and enhance their visual understanding of the Media world.



Year 7 Wicked Trip - London

The Year 7s recently visited London to watch Wicked at the Victoria Apollo Theatre with Miss Groves, Miss Maeer and Mr Mitchell.

A magical mystery tour was taken through the fantasy land of OZ and a great time was had by all; the performance itself was simply spell binding! A vivid reimagining of the classic The Wizard of Oz, Wicked spotlights the untold stories of Oz's most famous characters, namely the Wicked Witch of the West and her unlikely friend, Glinda the Good Witch. A cautionary tale about love, friendship and trust, Wicked effortlessly revealed that there are indeed two sides to every story, and the students were captivated from beginning to end!





In June, the Year 10s took part in a 'Revision Market Place' in order to prepare them for their mock exams in all subjects.

Staff created their own 'market stalls' packed with resources, exam papers and revision materials, so that students could sit down with expert teachers and work through a range of revision techniques. Subject specialists, ranging from English, Maths, Science, MFL, Citizenship, History, Geography, ICT, Music, PE and many more, were on hand to assist with any questions the students had, and the atmosphere in all of the classrooms was tremendous.

Attendance was excellent and students were very happy with the materials they went away with. They felt ready for their up and coming exams and this was clearly shown through their excellent results. Well done, Year 10. Keep it up for Year 11.



## **Developments for 2018-19**

As we continue to raise standards, as well as changing the Behaviour for Learning Policy and timings of the school day, we have also increased curriculum time for English and mathematics. Literacy and numeracy are essential life skills and will become a greater focus for next year as we aim to ensure all our students leave King's with great academic qualifications as well as becoming well rounded citizens. Weekly DEAR (Drop Everything and Read) sessions and focused form time activities of reading and 'numeracy ninjas' are being introduced. Also, groupings of students will be changing considerably as the newly constructed timetable gives Heads of Core subjects the flexibility to set more appropriately for their subject. In line with outstanding schools and research evidence (as well as our own geography results) students will be placed into broad, mixed ability groups for Foundation subjects. Consequently, your child will find their classes will be different for each core subject and their foundation classes, this will enable your child to make progress at a faster rate. Further developments for next year also include further refining our reporting systems and the introduction of a Homework Timetable for all students. A new Trust and school website are also being developed over the summer; we will keep you updated of all our developments!

Finally, as we move to sending letters via email we will be asking for your email addresses in September. Parent Forum and Parent Drop In will also continue next year and this information will be shared in our first letter of the next academic year.
