
Realistic career:

Teaching is a many female oriented job, with over $\frac{3}{4}$ of the education industry being female. It doesn't have to be a one- gender job as teaching is for everybody.

Teaching is a growing industry with more and more schools and teachers needed everyday. Primary School Teacher - Average Salary
The average salary for a Primary School Teacher is **£34,500 gross per year (£2,250 net per month)**, which is £4,900 (+17%) higher than the UK's national average salary. What I really want to know is, how do I get this job? To be a primary teacher you need a degree in teaching and GCSEs in Maths and English.


The film and performing industry is more commonly to be successful within women. With a 37%-67% of women making it in showbiz. The performing arts industry is still growing, while many other industries are shrinking. Circus skills are in demand. You could use skills in juggling, acrobatics, BMX and breakdancing. Behind the scenes, skilled technicians are in short supply. An average salary for and actor/ actress in the UK is anywhere between £5000 to £80,000 a year. To be in the performing business you will need some sort of professional training. Yes! In performing arts if you are lucky enough to land a role in a film or tv show you would have to travel to wherever the show/ filming is taking place.



If you want to teach in the UK you need a teacher's degree from any college or university. You will also need initial teachers training. How schools and local authorities can employ a postgraduate teacher apprentice, including using their apprenticeship levy. Guidance for candidates who want to apply to be a postgraduate teaching apprentice is available on the Get into Teaching website.

To be a primary school teacher you need; **GCSE grade C (4) or above in Mathematics and English**: for primary teaching you also need GCSE science grade C (4) or above. A degree: for primary teaching some ITT providers prefer you to have a degree in a national curriculum subject.

If you don't, you should talk directly to the training provider to see if they will accept your degree.

Although a formal acting education is not required, it is common for actresses to pursue at least some postsecondary education. There are many different cities throughout the country, such as Los Angeles, New York, and Atlanta, that are home to acting schools with acting courses and degree programs available.

You can get an apprenticeship for helping out on a set or being an understudy for a show or movie. You can get acting degrees from any college/ university but you will get more qualifications by going to a school specialising in performing. To get closer to this career I could join the school productions (after Covid) and do the Drama Club. Also pay close attention to constructive criticism.
